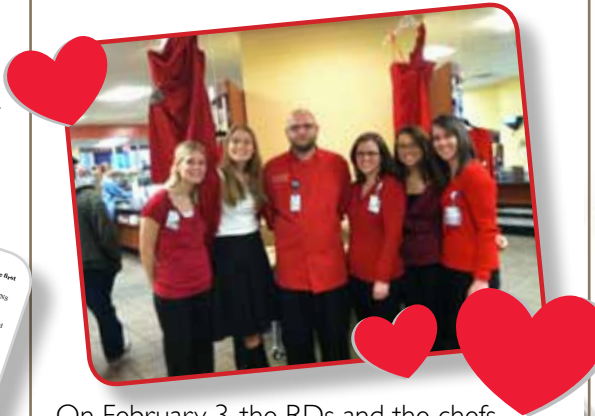
MHFS Regulatory UPDATE

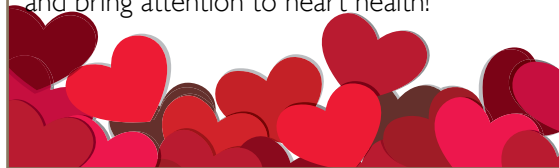


Red Dress Day for National Heart Month @ University of Virginia Health Systems
